## LOCATION AND ACCESSIBILITY

**The Southern Alberta Art Gallery Maansiksikaitsitapiitsinikssin is located on the south end of Galt Gardens in the heart of downtown Lethbridge, Alberta.**

Constructed in 1922 with funds from the Carnegie Corporation of New York, the building served as Lethbridge's main library for over 50 years before opening its doors as the Southern Alberta Art Gallery in 1976.

# PROGRAMS

### ARTICULATIONS

In the Articulations Art Lecture Series local and international artists, curators, critics, art historians, theorists, filmmakers, and more share their practice and engage in open, critical discussion.

### BLETCHER HOUR

The gallery's critical reading group, named after Lethbridge's first chief librarian, Hazel Bletcher, gathers every month for open discussion of the exhibitions and current events.

### CRAFTERNOON

Join us on the last open Saturday of each month for a self-directed art activity inspired by our current exhibitions.

### GALLERY LIBRARY

The Gallery Library holds an extensive collection of contemporary Canadian and international exhibition catalogues spanning from the late 1960s to the present.

### TINY PRESS

Tiny Press at SAAG is a handmade bookmaking studio that prints, binds, and distributes books by hand, creating original work with writers and artists of the region, about topics that are important to us.
